Why is SF so tricky to write about?

- Very context-dependent no clear always-applicable definition
- Subject-verb-object language doesn't convey systemic/interactional connections
- Meanings can and do shift (Wittgenstein meaning of a word is its use)
- Explanations can be (but are not always) minefields (esp for clients)
- Many things happen sometimes but not all the time
- Embracing emergence and uncertainty is hard in academic writing (which wants to be certain and always true)



So – how to approach writing SF?

- Don't despair!
- Write about practice which can be your experience, and that of your clients
- Make it specific! Give us the context for THIS work
- Include details of actual questions and client dialogue (with permission) – really helps bring it to life
- Connect with relevant previous literature
- Don't overclaim three cases of X diagnosis doesn't mean 'SF works with X diagnosis)
- If you want to write about theory (and good luck) then be prepared to get into tangles



 - Find a publisher (best option!)
 - Self publish (can work if you have lots of customers direct worth getting help)
- Your own blog or website
 - Substack becoming more popular
 - Need to share it!

What happens when you send in a piece to the journal?

- 'Full on' articles about research and conceptual developments
 - Assigned to one of the editors
 - They get two independent reviewers to look at it (double blind)
 - Reviews give comments and recommend
 - Accept (with minor changes)
 - Revise and resubmit (encouragement to continue!)
 - Reject (we have never given this while I have been editor)
- Opinion pieces
 - Assigned to one of the editors
 - Editor reviews it and may draw on other people
 - Usually some comments about how to improve it (encouragement to continue!)
- Book reviews
 - Looked at by book review editor (currently Mark)

Most articles are then sub-edited by our ex-journalist sub editor for minor polishing of the language

Things to watch out for

- We use APA formatting conventions for
 - References and citations
 - Headings (max three levels + NO 'Introduction')
 - Reference list in alphabetical order of first author
 - For experimental work standard headings for sections
- Follow the instructions on the website
 - Include a title sheet with authors, abstract keywords etc
 - Plus an anonymised manuscript (no authors) and with refs by the authors anonymised (replace name by 'Author'), such that you are not identifiable (we can help with this)
 - Please make sure you've read it carefully and corrected typos, and that all citations match up with references
- Stand by for constructive comments from reviewers!

Diversity, equity and inclusion

- We want to include as many voices as possible in the journal
- Work originating in languages other than English
- People who are not so accustomed to academic writing
- Translations into as many languages as possible (this needs volunteers please!)
- Stories of SF practice from around the world (including interviews)
